Receive, O Lord, this all-embracing Host which Creation, drawn to you, offers at this new dawn.

This bread, our toil, is of itself, I know, but an immense fragmentation; this wine, our pain, is no more, alas, than a transitory drink. Yet in the heart of this formless mass, you have placed an irresistible and sanctifying desire which makes us all cry out, believer and unbeliever alike:

“Lord, make us one”.

Pere Theilhard de Chardin was a French Jesuit who, in 1914, spent three months studying at the Jesuit College in Canterbury, within sight of St Stephen's Church. His time in Canterbury was cut short by the outbreak of the First World War when he returned to France to serve as a stretcher-bearer.

Performance Notes

Care should be taken with dynamics in this piece; the opening in particular should be sung softly and not rushed. In the second half of the piece, there should be a growing sense of intensity through increased dynamics and *some* rubato in the tempo, culminating in a real sense of ‘crying out’ at the end.

I'd like to particularly thank teachers in the languages department of The Harvey Grammar School for their assistance in setting the French text, and the ever-patient St Stephen's Church Choir who sang through early drafts and prepared so carefully the first public performance.
